16th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Last Sunday's "Good Samaritan" parable concluded with Jesus' command: Go provide hands-on mercy to the next person you meet, no conditions, no limits, no exceptions. But today, Jesus seems to criticize Martha's hands-on mercy of hospitality, while praising Mary's "hands-off" as "choosing the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary sat listening (10:39), leaving Martha "burdened with much serving by herself" (10:40). So, is the contemplative life of prayerful silence "superior," but the active life of earning a living, raising a family, running parishes, schools, hospitals, and social service ministries "second-class" discipleship? No; Jesus' example is not either/or but both/and: silent communion with God, boundless compassion for people. If we do not seek Jesus in silent prayer, how will we find Jesus in all others? If we do not serve Jesus in others, will our worship, despite its beauty, be anything but empty ritual? The *Jubilee of Mercy* offers us Jesus' two-fold challenge: both "go and do" and "sit and listen."

Second Reading - Paul speaks of the stewardship given to him to complete the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages past (Colossians 1:24-28).

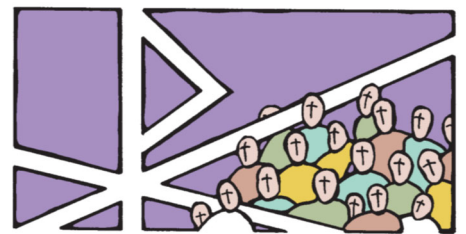
Gospel - Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. Mary has chosen the better part (Luke 10:38-42).

16° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La parábola del domingo pasado terminaba con la orden de Jesús: vayan a hacer obras de misericordia a su prójimo, sin condiciones, sin límites, sin excepciones. Pero hoy, Jesús parece que reprocha que Marta esté practicando la obra de misericordia de la hospitalidad, por el contrario parece que elogia a María "quien está haciendo nada" como que "escogió la mejor parte" (Lucas 10:42). María está sentada escuchando (10:39), dejando a Marta "sola con todo el quehacer" (10:40). ¿Entonces parece que la vida contemplativa del silencio es "superior" y, una vida activa, de trabajo, de familia, de hacer algún tipo de pastoral en la Iglesia, en la escuela, en un hospital o de asistencia social es un discipulado de "segunda clase"? La respuesta es NO. El ejemplo de Jesús no es: esto/aquello sino ambos/y; una comunión en silencio con Dios, una compasión sin límites por las personas. Si no buscamos a Jesús en la oración en silencio, ¿cómo encontraremos a Jesús en nuestros prójimos? Si no servimos a Jesús en el prójimo, ¿nuestra adoración, alabanza, culto, pese a su hermosura, será cualquier cosas además de un ritual vacío? Este *Jubilar de la Misericordia*, Jesús nos ofrece dos desafíos de Jesús: ambos "vayan y hagan" y "síentense y escuchen".

OBITUARY

Sr. Cesira Pierotti, FMA, age 97, died peacefully July 7, 2016 at the Salesian Sisters Provincial House in San Antonio, TX. She was preceded in death by her parents, Ubaldo and Rita Micheli Pierotti and her sister Alfea Paoletti and husband. Sr. Cesira is survived by a younger brother, Reno Pierotti and his wife. She is also survived by numerous nieces, nephews, a grand niece, cousins and her religious community, the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians – Salesian Sisters.



Sr. Cesira spent 75 years of her life as a Salesian Sister in the ministry of Catholic education and served primarily in New Jersey and California. Within her religious community she served in leadership roles on the local and provincial levels and for many years helped cultivate and nurture religious vocations as a member of the province formation team. Well into her 80's, when she could no longer be in active ministry due to failing health, she maintained contact by phone and by mail with the many past students and numerous people to whom she ministered. She had a zest for life and a winning smile that was characteristically hers. Even when illness weighed heavily upon her, she never refused a visit or a phone call from one of her countless friends. She enthusiastically took part in community prayer and get-togethers. Her devotion to the Mother of God, her deep faith and joyful demeanor were the hallmark signs of her Salesian vocation.

The visitation will be held at the Salesian Sisters Provincial House, 6019 Buena Vista Street, San Antonio on Monday, July 11, 2016, beginning 4:00 P.M. and will end with the prayer of the holy Rosary beginning at 7:00 P.M. The Mass of the Resurrection will be celebrated at the Provincial House at 9:00 A.M. on July 12th. Interment will follow at San Fernando Archdiocesan Cemetery No. 2, San Antonio. Welcome to the first week of Camp Savio! We are overjoyed to have about 328 children attend our summer camp this year. We, the counselors, are thankful to the parents who are trusting us with the job of giving their little angels a fun and safe summer.

For some children, Camp Savio may be a completely new experience to them and for others, it is their yearly ritual of an epic summer full of faith, fun, and amazing food! Along with many new campers, we also have received many new counselors who were once campers the year before. They are now old enough to be responsible for campers of their own and to grow in leadership skills.

Week 1 of camp was full of first experiences for both campers and counselors. Our counselors started off each day at 8:30 a.m. by gathering for a morning meeting where the Headmaster, Taaj, and Camp Director,



J.C. Montenegro, informed us about the events that will be taking place throughout the camp day. The day starts for the kids at 9:00 a.m. and a carefully planned schedule is given to each grade so they know where to be at certain times. During the week there are several main events that we look forward to everyday.

"Whole Camp" is one of them in which an hour is dedicated to a set of stations organized across the campus that have games both campers and counselors can participate in. Each day's Whole Camp is planned by our Rec[reation] Crew months in advance.

Another activity that the campers look forward to during the day is pool! Pool is an hour long session in which two grades at a time walk over to Saint John Bosco High School and spend time in the refreshing water. The campers also enjoy the Liturgy session which is basically arts and crafts that incorporate God and reflection in each activity.

This past Thursday, the entire camp enjoyed their first field trip to Seal Beach. The upper grades were able to walk around Main Street, visit some stores, and just explore. Now at the end of every week, instead of Whole Camp, we have a time called Spirit Rally. This is when all the grades have a cheer off for a chance to win the Spirit Stick. Each grade practices daily in preparation for the rally and the only way to win is to show Rec crew how spirited and unified they are as a group.

This week, I've noticed that the new campers have really opened up to their counselors and to their new environment. One of the many reasons that our counselors come to Camp Savio every summer is to help these kids come out of their comfort zones and to be a kid again, in a safe and welcoming environment. As a result, these children are growing in self-confidence and in their faith. We are ready and looking forward for the second week!
